Sustainability and Transformation Partnerships (STP) update

In February 2018, the latest NHS planning guidance renamed Sustainability and Transformation Partnerships (STP) restated the importance of partners working together to create what is now termed an integrated care system.

Healthier Lancashire and South Cumbria is one of the first areas in the country to become a shadow integrated care system (ICS). An integrated care system is a collaboration in which NHS, Local Authority, voluntary and other public sector partners will need to demonstrate how we will work effectively with the communities we serve. In doing so, this will bring together commissioners, providers and regulators to work in more cohesive ways.

The Lancashire and South Cumbria integrated care system covers a region made up of five local areas (Central Lancashire, West Lancashire, Pennine Lancashire, Fylde Coast, and Morecambe Bay). We are calling these areas integrated care partnerships or ICPs as the basis for local organisations and groups involved in health and care to join up their priorities and resources. Privacy update - accessing patient records

What do two hospital staff in Ipswich, a midwife in Coventry and a receptionist in Milton Keynes have in common? They all accessed records without a legitimate reason or clinical justification and have paid the consequences in more than one way. The two hospital workers accessed Ed Sheeran's record after he was admitted and treated at an Ipswich hospital resulting in one receiving a written warning and one being sacked. The midwife in Coventry was sacked and struck off after 14 years of viewing friends, colleagues, an ex-boyfriend and former neighbours' records without clinical justification. The receptionist in Milton Keynes during a nine month period looked 12 patient records including her ex-partner and a woman who claimed she had used the information to harass her was prosecuted under data protection legislation and was fined (offence 1 -£134, offence 2 - £166 and victim surcharge of £30).

All access to patient information within Trust is audited and monitored and at times staff may be called upon to explain the reason for their access. Even if accessing patient information is done with good intentions, staff looking at a clinical record or patient information outside their legitimate duties could face **disciplinary and legal action**. Staff must only access patient records where this is required for direct patient care or is required in the course of their duties. Unauthorised access includes accessing your own record, the records of people in the public eye, the records of family, friends, colleagues or neighbours. This access may be malicious or simple curiosity, it may even be at the request of the individual but they **ALL** represent unauthorised access and constitute a breach.
